If you want to know what services you might qualify for, they have a knowledgeable staff that can direct you. Through **Next Step**, you can get a wide variety of resources and programs that might fit your needs. Many organizations are there to help with your needs in our community.

Discharged from shelter for behavioral issues? Here's how to appeal:

- Meet with the Coordinator for Program Services. If not satisfied, contact the Center Director to schedule an appeal.
- Not satisfied with the meeting with the Center Director meeting? Contact the Housing Authority of Bergen County's Executive Director.

Denied shelter admission-or discharged?

Not satisfied with the meeting with the Program Manager? Contact the Director of the Shelter at 201-336-6475.

- Not satisfied with the meeting with the Director of the shelter?
- Then contact the Center Director by calling 201-336-6475. Not satisfied with the meeting with the Center Director? Then you need to contact the Housing Authority of Bergen County's Executive Director.

GRIEVANCE/APPEAL PROCEDURE

If an individual is not accepted for shelter or has been negatively discharged, they may appeal this decision as follows:

- For individuals denied shelter admission or discharged from the shelter on a clinical basis they should contact the Coordinator for Program Services and if not resolved they should contact the Center Director and finally the Housing Authority of Bergen County.
- For individuals who are denied shelter admission or discharged from the shelter for all other reasons should contact the Program Manager and if the issue is not resolved they should contact the Shelter Manager and if the issue is not resolved they should contact the Center Director and finally the Housing Authority of Bergen County. If you're still having trouble, contact Director of Human Services.

- 1) Call Access Department 800-730-2762.
- 2) Bring five days change of clothes. (Preferably tee-shirts, sweat pants or other comfortable clothes) (Hygiene products and, meals provided.)

Charity Care Income Criteria and Required Information

Patients are required to submit at least one (1) document from each of the four (4) categories listed below:

- 1. Valid Identification: Driver's License, State/County ID, Social Security card, Birth Certificate, and, if homeless, with none of the above forms of identification, attestation form will be completed.
- 2. Proof of New Jersey Residency for Date(s) of Service: Utility bill for date of service, valid driver's license, support letter. If homeless with none of the above forms of residency, attestation form will be completed.
- 3. Income Information: If employed, must present one of the following: Weekly income Four (4) most recent pay stubs, Bi-weekly income Two (2) most recent pay stubs, letter from employer on company letterhead (to include beginning date of employment, hourly wage, and number of hours worked weekly).

Here are some basic recipes for you:

Lemon Dill Chicken w/ a lite cream sauce over egg noodles

Melt butter, add a touch of garlic, some dill, then whisk in milk or half-and-half with about a teaspoon of flour until the sauce thickens and is smooth. For the chicken breast, sauté in olive oil, butter, some salt pepper and dill. The egg noodles only take about 8 minutes. Some of the food pantries give out frozen chicken. Check St. Cecilia's in Englewood and your local CFA (Center for Food Action).

Simple Quiche, with bacon or....

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Ingredients: 6 eggs, 1 cup milk, salt, pepper, paprika pinch, and any additions that you want! Brown bacon as you normally would, then break up into little pieces. Shread Swiss cheese. Tear stems off of spinach. Put bacon, cheese, and spinach in bottom of pie crust. Beat the liquid ingredients and seasonings. Pour liquid in to the crust about 2 cm. from top as it will rise. Bake 60 minutes, then cool on rack about 20 min.

Buttermilk Chicken:

Combine 1/2 cup panko bread crumbs, 2 tbs grated Parmesan cheese, 2 tbs kosher salt, pinch of pepper, 1-1/2 teaspoons paprika, 1 teaspoon onion powder, 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder, 1/4 teaspoon chili powder.

Prep chicken by letting dark meat set in buttermilk bath over night. Dip chick parts in the dry mix; lay on baking sheet, top with oil spray (like Pam). Bake for 1 hour. They should be golden brown.

This recipe might be made with chicken from your local food pantry, such as St. Cecilia's in Englewood, or CFA. Both usually give out chicken, so the cost per meal is about two dollars.

Vivitrol Support Group-This group provides medical monitoring and group therapy for opioid and alcohol dependent patients who chose this modality. Participants attend a minimum one group per month. They receive prescriptions from a board certified addiction psychiatry or medicine specialist and may be monitored to ensure clean toxicology screens. Medicare and Medicaid are welcome.

Good information for homeless in NJ and Bergen County! Most important thing is that the statewide homeless hotline is 211!!

For those who are homeless, seek shelter! Start by calling 211 to reach New Jersey's state-wide homeless hotline or go to nj211.org on line. If you are homeless and on the streets and your Last Permanent Address is in Bergen County, the Next Step program at the Bergen County Housing, Health & Human Services Center will assist you to screen for shelter eligibility and to apply if you are eligible. Call 211 or 201-336-6475 for instructions how to reach Next Step.The Center is serving take-out lunch and dinner to community guests. Lunch is available for pick-up from 12:15-12:30 every day. Dinner is available from 5:45-6:00 every day. Stop in the Center lobby to grab a meal ticket, and take it to the loading dock to trade it in for a meal. Next Step is closed to walk-in community guests, but most services are available by phone or by appointment. Call 201-336-6475 and ask to be transferred to Next Step.Most important: If you are on the streets, you should be applying for shelter!
